 The lessons and field trips have been the highlight of our year so far! Getting to dissect a trout is an experience they will never forget. And getting the students out of the classroom and into nature with an expert to guide us was such a rich learning experience. Students learned so much about different birds, bugs and the ecosystem around Vancouver Lake.



 Class lessons & field lessons provide an expertise and resources that I, as a classroom teacher, would not be able to provide. Lessons are hands on and very engaging, students look forward to this opportunity every year.



 One student in particular is wheelchair bound, and he was able to get out in nature, on a trail and get his hands on things he has never touched before. He expressed that he hadn't been on a hike, and he had never held a frog or a caterpillar before. These are things that I know will stick with him and make him eager to get back out in nature when he has the opportunity to do so.



• I have a couple of favorite stories: When we were on the trail approaching the lake, and Vancouver Lake came into view, one of my students stopped in his tracks and said "Oh, it is so beautiful. Can anyone come here?" Another is my observational experience with one of my more "active" students in class. He walked by my side the entire trip, by choice, and was curious about everything we saw. He hushed the other children so we could hear the birds and just found every little thing to point out and ask about. I've never seen him so engaged!

Burnt Bridge Creek Restoration Project

- Mouth of Burnt Bridge Creek
- Water quality focused restoration designs
 - Reconnect the creek to the floodplain
 - Capture pollutants and sediment
- Reduce high flows, recharge ground water
- Preliminary restoration designs being developed by Wolf Water Resources
- Funding from an Estuary Partnership WA Ecology 319 grant
